The new SEN website was launched in Feb '23- a more modern look and feel consistent with positioning SEN as WA's leading clean energy advocate.

The SWIS Decarbonisation Campaign 2022-23 kicked-off in February progressed with follow-up meetings with EPWA and AEMO, and meeting with the Energy Minister's chief advisor.

SEN wrote to AEMO, Bill Johnston and environment minister on the Gas Statement of Opportunities (140%)



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increase in gas usage for power generation on the SWIS)

SWIS Demand Assessment released in May 2023 – raised many questions – especially around funding transmission upgrades and a transition authority. SEN response submitted resulting in an invite from EPWA Modelling and technical groups met regularly and working on an update to SEN's SWIS modelling to cover Collie closure

SEN members Rob Phillips, Len Bunn and Gus King launched the Broome Clean Energy Study 2022 SEN progressed energy input into Climate Positive Perth study led by Dr Brad Pettitt

Casual vacancies on the committee advertised and filled through Volunteering Australia (Nasrin, Emily K, Gabriel, Emily P, Tash)

SEN more active in the media – energy is moving quickly, attracting interest from ABC Radio.

Committee met monthly to progress various initiatives and actions

Commentary

Total income has increased by \$3,611, driven by \$5,000 report fees (2022: nil)

Membership fees - reduced by \$12933 due to lagging renewals/ lapsing members. 62 paying members in 2023, of which 28 are new members.

SEN Presents ticket sales have reduced by \$733, driven by some events being held without charge and a Committee decision to subsidise.

As a result, SEN Presents events ran at a loss of \$411 in 2023 (2022: \$864 profit), and costs are expected in increase in 2024 due to venue hire costs

Website expenses have increased by \$7,286, driven by significant investment in a new website (now live)

Marketing and printing costs are driven by refresh of new logo and refreshed marketing and event materials

Transaction fees are primarily paypal charges for collection of membership fees and SEN ticketing, which was included within the income line items in 2022.
